
Concept Breakdown

- What will be a node?
- What fields will it have?

What will be a Node?

: a point at which subsidiary parts originate or center

a Node is "the thing itself"



What fields will it have?

What "subsidiary parts originate or center" on your node?

Think of attributes or properties required by your concept that are associated with each item you've determined to be a node.

Think of an address book

Think of an address book

If an address book is your concept...

Each entry of a person is a node.

Each phone number, email address, etc is a field to that node.

Concept Breakdown

- How will it be added?
- How will it be displayed?
- How will it be interacted with?

It is possible to configure Drupal for basic concepts without adding anything to it.


node = basic page fields = title, body


How will it be:


added: node/add/page


displayed: front page view, on its own



You need Views if

- You like the default front page view, but you find you want to sort it differently.
- You like the default taxonomy/term view, but you find you want to sort it differently; for example, alphabetically.
- You use /tracker, but you want to restrict it to posts of a certain type.
- You like the idea of the 'article' module, but it doesn't display articles the way you like.
- You want a way to display a block with the 5 most recent posts of some particular type.
- · You want to provide 'unread forum posts'.
- You want a monthly archive similar to the typical Movable Type/Wordpress archives that displays a link to
 the in the form of "Month, YYYY (X)" where X is the number of posts that month, and displays them in a
 block. The links lead to a simple list of posts for that month.

Views can do a lot more than that, but those are some of the obvious uses of Views.

For new installs of Drupal 6, we recommend the 6.x-3.x branch. We have not changed the recommended version you see below, because there is an upgrade bug in 6.x-2.x that causes upgraded views to break.

Option 1
node = image
fields = title, description, tags, etc
added = node/add/image for each image
display = gallery of images
interacted = click to view next, larger, or own
page, hover for more info?
```

Option 1 Pros

- More info per Image
- More info in display
- More freedom in display placement per image
- More interaction options

Option 1 Cons

- More complicated workflow for adding images
- More complicated in display ordering
- Complicated gallery interaction options

```
Option 2
node = gallery
fields = images
added = node/add or edit gallery
add image to a multifield
display = each node is a gallery showing all its
image fields
interacted = click to view next, larger
```

Option 2 Pros

- Fast gallery creation
- Easy interface for ordering
- More gallery interaction options

Option 2 Cons

- Less info per Image
- More restriction in display placement per image
- Fewer interaction options

Comparison

Option 1 node = image

Option 2 node = gallery

What you choose to be your node determines the pros you will enjoy and the cons you will need to overcome in completing your concept.
